PLEASE NOTE: THIS IS A LIST OF THE MOST COMMON MEDICATIONS THAT AFFECT BLEEDING. IF YOUR MEDICATION IS NOT LISTED BUT FALLS INTO ONE OF THE CATEGORIES PLEASE DISCONTINUE. PLEASE REVIEW ALL MEDICATIONS YOU ARE TAKING, INCLUDING OVER THE COUNTER MEDICATIONS WITH YOUR PRESCRIBING PROVIDER AND FAMILY PHYSICIAN.

The following medication affects the blood clotting process and should be discontinued FIVE DAYS prior to your surgery. Failing to do so may increase the risk of complications related to bleeding. You may restart 24hrs following the procedure, unless otherwise directed by your Primary Care Physician or Specialist. □ Coumadin (Warfarin) The following medication affects the blood clotting process and should be discontinued THREE DAYS prior to your surgery. Failing to do so may increase the risk of complications related to bleeding. You may restart 24hrs following the procedure, unless otherwise directed by your Primary Care Physician or Specialist. □ Plavix (Clopidogrel) The following medications affect the blood clotting process and should be discontinued the day before your surgery. Failing to do so may increase the risk of complications related to bleeding. You may restart 24hrs following the procedure, unless otherwise directed by your Primary Care Physician or Specialist. □ Apixaban Brilinta Dabigatran Eliquis Pradaxa Rivaroxaban Ticagrelor Xarelto **Herbal Medications** Stop all herbal medications one week prior to surgery. These supplements may interact with clotting, healing, and anesthesia. Including but not limited to: □ Echinacea Fish Oil □ Ephedra Garlic Ginseng Ginkogo Kava St. John's Wort Valerian Omega 3 Disease-Modifying Antirheumatic Drugs (DMARDs) Stop all DMARDs 1-2 weeks prior to surgery and resume 1-2 weeks after surgery unless otherwise indicated by your Rheumatologist or Primary Care Physician. This will reduce the risk of infection at the surgical site.
